Executive Summary:	This assessment looks at the potential impact of proposed changes to how students access advice and support from the Student Funding Team.	
	The main change involves use of the online contact us function as the primary method of communication about funding. Telephone and face-to-face will be used only as required and as the exception.	
	The impact of any changes made will be reviewed using student feedback.	
	Although negative impacts have been identified for some protected characteristic groups, it is recognised that the use of online contact will be a more accessible option for most individuals because students will be able to make initial contact with the funding team at any point.

Positive Impact - Contact can be made with Student Funding Team 24 hours a day using the online function rather than within office hours so can be done to fit with individual's needs. Negative impact - Student Association feedback suggests that some mature students would benefit from additional IT support in the first few weeks of college.

There is increased capacity to support with additional devices and Wi-Fi connectivity.

Care experienced students benefits from dedicated support, which will mean that provided students disclose any issues – they will be picked up promptly.

Written guidance will inform students that this support is available if they disclose that they are care experienced to the student advice service.

Positive Impact - Contact can be made with Student Funding Team 24 hours a day using the online function rather than within office hours so can be done to fit with individual's needs.

Marriage/Civil Partnership Married couples and civil partnership should be treated the same on a wide range of matters	Positive Impact - Contact can be made with Student Funding Team 24 hours a day using the online function rather than within office hours so can be done to fit with individual's needs.
Race Refers to a group of people defined by their race, colour and nationality (including citizenship) ethnic or national origins	Positive Impact - Contact can be made with Student Funding Team 24 hours a day using the online function rather than within office hours so can be done to fit with individual's needs.
Sexual Orientation A persons sexual and/or romantic attraction to other people, or lack thereof	Positive Impact - Contact can be made with Student Funding Team 24 hours a day using the online function rather than within office hours so can be done to fit with individual's needs.

This can be mitigated by arranging telephone or face-to-face (digital) appointments where required. Additional support for this group may also be available through the student support service. Written advice will signpost students to this additional support. Positive Impact - Contact can be made with Student Funding	
dayto-day activities	Team 24 hours a day using the online function rather than within office hours so can be done to fit with individual's needs.	
	Positive Impact – An online system may encourage more requests for funding support from students who would ordinarily avoid face-to-face conversations due to underlying anxieties and associated mental health issues.	
Gender identity/ reassignment The process of transitioning from one gender to another (can include changing names, pronouns, dressing differently, medical intervention and living in their selfidentified gender)	Positive Impact - Contact can be made with Student Funding Team 24 hours a day using the online function rather than within office hours so can be done to fit with individual's needs.	
Pregnancy/maternity Refers to being pregnant and the period after birth (linked to maternity leave in the employment context)	Positive Impact - Contact can be made with Student Funding Team 24 hours a day using the online function rather than within office hours so can be done to fit with individual's needs.	
Religion or Belief Religious and philosophical beliefs, including lack of belief (atheism)	Positive Impact - Contact can be made with Student Funding Team 24 hours a day using the online function rather than within office hours so can be done to fit with individual's needs.	
Sex Gender assigned at birth	Positive Impact - Contact can be made with Student Funding Team 24 hours a day using the online function rather than within office hours so can be done to fit with individual's needs.	

Student Carer Providing unpaid care to a family member or friend who could not cope without their support.	Positive impact. Contact can be made with Student Funding Team 24 hours a day using the online function rather than within office hours so can be done to fit with individual's needs.	
Employment or Trade Union Membership	Positive Impact - Contact can be made with Student Funding Team 24 hours a day using the online function rather than within office hours so can be done to fit with individual's needs.	
Past Criminal Convictions	Positive Impact - Contact can be made with Student Funding Team 24 hours a day using the online function rather than within office hours so can be done to fit with individual's needs.	
Poverty or Deprivation	Negative impact. Those from the most deprived groups are less likely to have access to devices and internet connections in order to contact the service. This could be mitigated by asking this group to contact student services for support. Additional support is in place for students to access college laptops and improved wifi access. Positive Impact - Contact can be made with Student Funding Team 24 hours a day using the online function rather than within office hours so can be done to fit with individual's needs.
