## **Equality Impact Assessment**

Document:	Loan Laptop EIA	
Executive Summary:	This is to assess the impact of an eligibility criteria for student provision of loan laptops.	
	The criteria put forward is that all full-time funded students will be eligible for a loan laptop but encouraged to use their own if they have one. All other students who require a loan laptop but do not meet these conditions will still be accommodated as far as possible, particularly if this may prevent them from participating at all in college. This includes DEBI, part time and any other types of course or student.

Age Someone belonging to a particular age, or range of ages	Low impact. Students in the lowest age group are most likely to not have access to their own funds or the family finances to buy a suitable device. If the student is funded however they will be eligible for a loan laptop regardless of age.  Students of different ages may prefer/engage with different communication methods – ensure the process is regularly communicated in a wide range of ways to ensure the information is cascaded effectively.  Younger students often benefit from additional support around getting prepared for college. It would be useful to send information on laptop loan process directly to schools so they can
	share with pupils and parents/provide support and advocacy where necessary.

Care Experienced students may be less likely to own a suitable device for their studies. They are however more likely to be funded and will be eligible for a loan laptop.

If a student is care experienced but not funded and does not have a suitable device, this should be flagged at the earliest opportunity to allow ISLT to include in the laptop provision.

Race Refers to a group of people defined by their race, colour and nationality (including citizenship) ethnic or national origins	No impact

Disability A physical or mental impairment which has a substantial and	A student with a disability may require devices that are equipped beyond the standard specification. This may mean they are less likely to have an appropriate device to allow them to study.

Past Criminal Convictions	All students will have the same access to loan laptops regardless of past criminal convictions except where there is a concern around this eg. The student is not allowed to possess a device as part of their legal conditions. In these circumstances curriculum and ISLT staff should work together to ensure that the student can access learning in full in an appropriate way.	
Poverty or Deprivation	Students experiencing poverty are far less likely to own a suitable device. The majority of these students will be funded and will be eligible for loan devices. If there are any students who are not funded and experiencing poverty this should be flagged through	

the appropriate channels as soon as identified and to ISLT to include in the numbers for provision of laptops.
